- Civil Defence Evacuation Point
- Hosting sports groups such as FIFA, rugby league, netball and Capoeira
- Accommodating artists and guests for the Indigenous Runway Project
- Hosting WOMAD artists and guests to Taranaki
- Hosting international and national dignitaries
- Hosting youth who attended local church conference
- Provided a venue for the Koha Shed
- Hosted other Iwi groups from the Taranaki rohe
- Celebrated 10,000 healthy homes and 300 jobs in Waitara with WISE Better Homes
- Hosted He Hui Whakahonoga ki Taranaki with Minister for Maori Development
- Celebrated Queens Honour recipient Mina Timutimu

Advancing, encouraging and supporting the interests of all beneficiaries were also a priority in the form of:

- Hosting the return of the Motunui Epa panels
- Hosting Iwi and Hapu hui for Te Atiawa
- Being available as a venue to host whanau birthdays, unveilings and tangihanga
- Encouraging the use of Marae for youth, kapahaka and kaumatua
- Rangatahi Youth Court

Additional Information:

For the 2015 year, the Trust welcomed individual donations as well as group contributions and intiatives towards the Marae Development project. None of the funds raised have been expended to date, with a view to grow the funds to demonstrate the ability to fundraise towards the project using own resources, whanau contributions and intiatives.

This financial year, an application was submitted to the TSB Community Trust for assistance to prepare a feasibility study, concept and conservation plans for the redevelopment of the Marae. The application has been tentatively accepted provided further conditions to be met. It is envisaged that these conditions will be met in late 2016 with completion in 2017.

Statement of Service Performance For the Year Ended 31st March 2016

In late December 2015, the Trustees accepted a proposal, to initiate a schedule of repairs and maintenance activities on the Marae, in particular the restoration and painting of the Waharoa, Sir Maui Pomare monument and the investment to see Te Ikaroa A Maui lighting earthed and certified.

Grants received enabled the Marae to purchase resources to continue to host guests, as well as ensuring the Marae, buildings and contents have up to date insurance cover.

The Trust is reliant on funding from New Plymouth District Council to cover annual insurance costs.

The Trust received funding from the Taranaki Regional Council to assist with the completion of an "Emergency Response Plan" in June 2015. This Plan outlines the capability and capacity for the Trust to respond to a civil defence emergency as a Evacuation Welfare Centre. The Plan also serves as an Emergency Evacuation Procedure for the Reservation should an emergency event occur such as a fire, earthquake or tornado.

Funding received from Methanex enabled the Trust to purchase a reliable and compact photocopier with the capability to scan, email, print and copy Trust documents.

Lotteries funding was received to assist with ensuring the Marae can continue to host guests in the form of:

- Advertising: calling people to return to the Marae to assist with cleaning and tidying of the Marae grounds, facilities and resources
- Cleaning and laundry including hand towels for rest rooms and kitchen
- Utilities gas to cook with
- Refuse as the Marae is not part of the local waste collection, funds were used to assist in paying for weekly waste disposal bin
- Pillows x100
- Flip top tables with wheels x14 making it easier for the Ringawera to set up and move tables in Ko Tamawahine

Funding has also been received from COGS, which has enabled the Trust to maintain effective and efficient administration services for the Trust.

STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Preparation

Manukorihi Pa Reserve Trustees has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not for Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000.

All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity is a going concern and will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

This is the first year of adoption of Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting in light of the requirements of the Charities Act 2005. It previously followed Special Purpose Financial Reporting Framework and the comparative numbers have not been restated.

2. Goods & Services Tax

These financial statements have been prepared inclusive of GST as Manukorihi Pa Reserve Trustees is not registered for GST.

3. Income Tax

The entity is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

4. Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

5. Changes in Accounting Policies

This year the value of the exsisting Pa buildings were added to the Trust assets. They have been valued at the rateable value as at valuation date of 1 September 2013.

Plant & Equipment were valued by Registerd Public Valuer as at 28 March 2016. Due to the date of the valuation, no depreciation has been calculated this year but will calculate in future years.

Taonga and Maori cultural artifacts such as carvings and tukutuku panels are not reflected in the asset register nor the Marae Insurance.

All other accounting policies were applied on a consistent basis during the year.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Trustees of:

Report on the Performance

We have audited the accompanying performance report of Manukorihi Pa Reserves Trustees on pages 5 to 12 which comprises the entity information, the statement of service performance, the statement of financial performance and statement of cash flows for the year ended 31 March 2016, the statement of financial position as at 31 March 2016, and the statement of accounting policies and other explanatory information.

The Responsibility of the Trustees for the Performance Report

The Trustees are responsible on behalf of the entity for:

 - in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting Accrual (Not-For-Profit) issued in New Zealand by the New Zealand Accounting Standards Board, and
- c) for such internal control as the trustees Executive determine is necessary to enable the preparation of the performance report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the performance report based on our audit. We conducted our audit of the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flows, statement of accounting policies and notes to the performance report in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) (ISAs (NZ), and the audit of the entity information and statement of service performance in accordance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagements (New Zealand) ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised). Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the performance report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the performance report, including performing procedures to obtain evidence about and evaluating whether the reported outcomes and outputs and quantification of the outputs to the extent practicable, are relevant, reliable, comparable and understandable. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the performance report, whether due to fraud or error.



In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the performance report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes, evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the performance report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Existence of any other Relationship of the Auditor with the Entity

Other than in our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in, Manukorihi Pa Reserves Trustees

Basis for Qualified Opinion

The financial statements include income from Koha, Booking Fees, catering and accommodation over which limited controls exist prior to the cash received being recorded in Manukorihi Pa Reserve Trustees' accounting records. There are no practical procedures available to us to confirm the completeness of this revenue, and accordingly, we were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence in this regard. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to the revenue recorded were necessary.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion except the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion:

- a) the reported outcomes and outputs, and quantification of the outputs to the extent practicable, in the statement of service performance are suitable;
- b) the performance report on pages 5 to 12 presents fairly in all material respects:
