

New governance requirement



Section 42G - Duty to review governance procedures

(1) A charitable entity **must review** its governance procedures

(where those are set out in its rules or elsewhere)

at least every three years.

New governance requirement (cont.)



When conducting a review you must consider whether your governance procedures:

- (a) Are fit for purpose and
- (b) Assist the charity to achieve its charitable purpose and
- (c) Assist the charity to comply with the requirements of this Act


